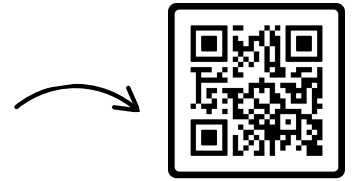

WAYS TO VOTE

There are lots of ways to vote and make your voice heard.

ADVANCE VOTING

- You can vote early at your designated polling location!
- **Advance voting days are on April 18th, 19th, 20th, and 21st, from 9 AM to 9 PM EST.**
- Bring an ID showing your name and address.
- Scan the QR code on the right and find your voting location and list of candidates in your riding or visit: www.elections.ca.

VOTE ON ELECTION DAY

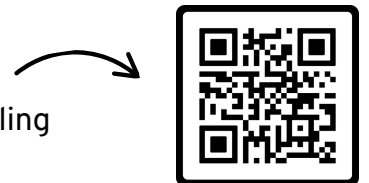
- **Election Day is on April 28th, from 9 AM - 9 PM EST.**
- Vote at your designated polling location. Scan the QR code above to find your location.
- **You don't need to be on the voters list to vote! Just bring an ID that shows your name and address. *See the other side for more details.***

VOTE BY MAIL

- Apply online by April 22nd by 6 PM EST to get your voting kit: tinyurl.com/c6y6eb7a
- Apply by phone by April 22nd by 6 PM EST at 1-800-463-6868 or 1-800-361-8935 (TTY) to get a form sent to you.
- If you have family or friends who've lived in Canada but are currently living abroad, they can vote by mail too: tinyurl.com/bdf97vr7
- Make sure Elections Canada receives your completed ballot by April 28th

VOTE IF YOU'RE UNHOUSED OR RECEIVE SERVICES

- If you live at or get services from a shelter, soup kitchen, long-term care home, student residence, or Indigenous centre, you can ask staff for a **Letter of Confirmation of Residence**: tinyurl.com/y444u2mb
- Bring that letter and any ID with your name – even if it's expired.
- If you don't have ID, someone who knows you and is voting at your polling station can vouch for you. The person will need their own ID and can vouch for one person.

WHO CAN VOTE

- You're at least 18 years old
- You're a Canadian citizen
- Show proof of identity and address

IF YOU'RE REGISTERED

Bring any government-issued ID with your name and address, like:

- A Health Card
- A Photo Card
- Credit or Debit Card
